The Community Futures Program is a federally funded initiative that has been supporting communities and their businesses for over 30 years. Under the guidance of a volunteer Board of Directors and a team of dedicated Staff, CFEP provides business counseling, training, lending and economic assistance. The following lists a few of our highlights from the past year:

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual **Marketing Plan Challenge.** Congratulation to our finalists: 1<sup>st</sup> place *Dirt Road Pretty* of Stettler, 2<sup>nd</sup> place *Maude Edon* of Delburne, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place *Summit Psychology Inc.* of Stettler.
- Partnered with Alberta Rotary Clubs and the southern CF Offices for the 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual **Rotary Alberta Youth Entrepreneurship Camp** in August.
- Partnered with Community Futures Alberta, CF Meridian, CF East Central and CF Capital Region for the Community Resiliency Opportunity Project (CROP), a program designed to develop the tools, systems and capacity needed to support the change that impacted communities in the 'coal affected' regions of Alberta.

However, the activities of the past year have been overshadowed by the recent coronavirus pandemic, as individuals and businesses focus on health and safety, as well as how they will weather the economic uncertainties that have resulted. The challenges we shall all face will continue for the foreseeable future, and our mandate will take on increased importance. We are confident that we can meet the challenge head-on and help create success stories for our region.

#### 2019-2020 Lending Statistics:

- 16 applications presented to the Board
- **11 loans approved** where funds disbursed—(1 from 2018-2019
- \$888,200 disbursed— (\$150,00 from 2018-2019)
- \$702,000 funds leveraged
- 31.5 full-time equivalent jobs maintained or created-(7 from 2018-2019)
- 1 loan totaling \$75,000 from 2019-2020 approved yet disbursed in 2020-2021, maintaining or creating 5 full time equivalent jobs, and leveraging \$10,000
- Interest rate remained steady at **7.20%** throughout the year
- 465 instances of business training and/or coaching
